

Poster Presentation Guidelines for BSVER ASCon XXXII

A well-designed poster effectively communicates your research and engages the audience. Follow these guidelines to ensure your poster presentation is professional and impactful.

Title:

Include the title of your presentation at the top of the poster. Characters should be a minimum of 72-100 point font size. After title, please mention the following points; Authors name, Department/affiliations. The title should be the same as in the submitted abstract.

Size:

*The poster must be no less than A1 and no larger than A₀ size (A₀ size is 841mm x 1189mm). Orientation of your poster must be in **portrait style**.*

Lettering

The poster should be easily readable at a distance of two metres. Use upper and lower case for general content as the use of all-capital text is difficult to read. Avoid using a mixture of type/font styles.

Headings

48-point font size is recommended for headings.

Content

1. Title & Author Information
 - Title: Short, clear, and bold (Font size: 72–100 pt).
 - Author(s) and affiliation(s): Clearly mentioned below the title (Font size: 36–48 pt).
2. Introduction/Background
 - Brief context and research objectives (Font size: 24–36 pt).
3. Materials and Methods
 - Concise explanation of research methodology (Font size: 24–36 pt).
4. Results
 - Use graphs, charts, or tables for clarity.
 - Limit text, focus on visuals (Font size: 24–36 pt).
5. Conclusion
 - Highlight key takeaways and impact (Font size: 24–36 pt).
6. Acknowledgments (If required)
 - Minimal and concise (Font size: 18–24 pt).

Poster Printing

Presenting authors should print PVC or mat paper

Poster Presentation

Poster must be presented by the presenting author during the session. If presenting author is absent for any unavoidable circumstance then registered co-author may of course present but will not be eligible for the best poster award.
